From the day of the beatification, May 1, until all of the flow of the faithful, the remains of John Paul II will be exhibited for veneration in St. Peter's Basilica, in front of the Altar of the Confession. Next, you will make a strictly private burial in the chapel of San Sebastian.

Saturday, April 30, 2011

From 20.00 to 22.30 at the Circus Maximus will celebrate the vigil of preparation, led by Cardinal Agostino Vallini, Vicar General of His Holiness for the Diocese of Rome, and Pope Benedict XVI will join spiritually through a video link.

Sunday, May 1, 2011

At 10.00 will start in St. Peter's Square presided over the celebration of the beatification by the Pope. Participation is not regulated by individual tickets, but access to the Square and adjacent areas will be under the protection of public safety.
